After dinner, guests will gather in the Great Room to meet the park naturalists for an informative elk program to kick off the weekend.

After enjoying a hot breakfast Saturday morning, guests will pick up their prepared lunches and meet the park naturalists to begin the auto tour of the PA Wilds! The self-driven Pennsylvania Scenic Byway tour will traverse through breathtaking landscapes as guests make their way to Hyner View State Park. Greeted by an impressive mountaintop lookout, guests will stop at Hyner View to eat lunch, take in the view, and enjoy a local history program. The auto tour will then proceed to the Elk Country Visitor Center where guests have the opportunity to look for live elk on the center grounds. In addition to that, guests will receive tickets to the center's immersive 4-D theatre as well as the horse-drawn wagon ride of the elk viewing fields! Be sure to bring your cameras and dress for the weather!

Pricing includes all items detailed to the right. Guests must provide their own transportation for the auto tour or carpool with others. Total mileage of the auto tour from Bald Eagle State Park to the Elk Country Visitor Center is about 160 miles, round-trip.
